<u>Duties & Responsibilities:</u>	Speak to community groups about HIV and its transmission. Groups traditionally include middle and high school students, students at alternative schools, clients of drug and alcohol treatment facilities, and special-needs populations. May also be asked to make presentations at special events such as educational workshops, University of Oregon Sex Week, and World AIDS Day.		
<u>Skills & Qualifications:</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Experience speaking with diverse populations and ages groups is helpful, but not required • Comfortable speaking to large and small groups • Willing to speak frankly about sexuality • Willing to routinely perform demonstrations of how to properly use male and female condoms • Knowledge or willingness to learn about state approved sex education and HIV transmission • Ability to pass agency criminal background check 		
<u>Benefits & skills developed:</u>	Volunteers will gain: an understanding of education/health promotion program content and development; experience in presentation to a wide variety of audiences; and data collection and management. Will also enhance time management skills.
